Lupo has roots in the Douglas County community. He graduated in 2002 from Alexander High School and his parents have continued to reside in the area. After obtaining Bachelor of Science and Master of Public Administration degrees from Georgia College in Milledgeville, Georgia and a short stint as a tennis pro in Bakersfield, California, he returned to Georgia to work with the Georgia Department of Economic Development as a project analyst and later an international trade policy and special projects manager. Lupo was recruited to join the Louisiana Economic Development team which took him to his current position in Baton Rouge.
